

Heartworm positive

Darla started treatment on February 27, 2019. She has received her 2 rounds of shots and is now required to stay as calm as possible for at least 6 weeks. This is tough for Darla because she is only 1 year old and LOVES to run and play with other dogs. She goes on several leash walks a day and does have a calm young dog as a kennel mate. Her treatment costs \$500 and the money was raised on Facebook for her. She was transferred in from a high kill shelter in Tulsa and is our 3rd heartworm positive dog.

Surgery to remove large growth

ARF currently has 2 dogs that need to have surgery to remove large growths. The first one is Mid-Knight who is a Great Dane/Mastiff/Lab mix. We thought his large 3" hanging skin tag was huge until we took in Baby Girl.

Baby Girl is a 8 year old Dachshund who has a massive skin tag coming from her chest that is dragging the ground. Both dogs are scheduled for surgery on 3/8/19 to have the growths removed. The cost will be roughly \$320 each depending on how many blood vessels are involved. Baby Girl will also get an Xray of her spine and her teeth cleaned.

Forever Foster Homes for Senior Pets

When a senior animal has a guesstimated lifespan of less then 1 or 2 years they may qualify for a Forever Foster Home. In a Forever Foster Home the senior animal has essentially been adopted, but ARF shares in some of the medical expenses for the remainder of their life.



We seem to have a small elderly dog or two in our care all the time. These small dogs usually come from a home where the previous owners have passed away or gone into assisted living. They are normally calm little lap dogs that are often housebroken. Please come in and visit us to see what we currently have. They are adopted quickly and we are unable to keep a call back list of people's needs. It's just too time consuming for our volunteers to handle.
